## Vision

We seek to be the hands of Christ through expressions of mercy and love. We aspire to live out our ministry of healing and caring to fulfill the need for quality services offered in a Christian environment. We seek to provide an ever-widening and enriched continuum of high-quality services. We commit ourselves to the Christian principles on which we were founded, thereby enabling us to carry out God's work with integrity and compassion.

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Merriam-Webster defines extraordinary as going beyond what is usual, regular, or customary; exceptional to a very marked extent. That defines Christian Health Care Center (CHCC). Our senior-life, mental-health, and short-term rehab services, programs, and residences expanded in size and scope in 2017. We received significant recognition on state and national levels. We reached out to help people locally and across the country. All was possible with God's blessings and a steadfast commitment to our mission.



## **SENIOR LIFE**

Our senior life residences grew significantly with the acquisition of **Summer Hill at Wayne**. This affordable senior-housing complex includes 140 one-bedroom and 24 two-bedroom apartments. Here, we introduced a dining program, expanded activities, and made numerous improvements to building grounds, exteriors, and interior common areas.

Summer Hill, combined with **Siena Village at Wayne** and Evergreen Court in **Wyckoff**, raises CHCC's total number of affordable senior-housing apartments to 454. These communities offer more than just a home for seniors. We designed them to address our residents' physical, emotional, and spiritual needs.

The Longview Assisted Living Residence was transformed through a major renovation and refurbishment project, thanks to our 2015 and 2016 Annual Funds. In Longview, a new Village Café was created, the Great Room expanded, and the Private Dining Room, salon, and rehab/wellness center refurbished. In the Courtyard, Longview's community for individuals in early- to mid-stages of memory loss and dementia, the Activity Room was renovated and expanded, and two additional semi-private resident suites were added.

**Southgate** behavior-management unit marked 20 years of service. Our special-care inpatient skilled-nursing residence is one of only four such programs in New Jersey. Treatment addresses and modifies combative, disruptive, and disturbing behavior associated with dementia and other forms of cognitive illnesses. Renovations and refurbishments to Southgate will begin in 2018.

Christian Health Care Adult Day Services of Wayne and Wyckoff were the recipients of three new vans courtesy of a NJ Transit grant program. To date, we have received nine vans through this program. They are vital to our ability to











transport clients in more than 50 North Jersey towns to our locations. Each year, the fleet of vans travels nearly 162,000 miles!

The nearly 1,100 seniors entrusted to our care have valuable experiences, which have often framed their lives. Their stories are shared through our **Resident** Speakers Bureau, which was established in 2017. Presentations included a Siena Village resident describing her deeply moving story as a Holocaust survivor, and a Summer Hill resident revealing fascinating behind-the-scenes stories of his days as an audio technician for Broadway shows.

## **MENTAL HEALTH**

To help parents and their children feel more comfortable, **Christian Health** Care Counseling Center unveiled a designated child and adolescent area. The section, which includes a reception desk, waiting room, and playroom, offers privacy, safety, and a warm, caring setting. Children's anxieties are eased by being able to play during an appointment, and adolescents value privacy while waiting.

The Ramapo Ridge Partial-hospitalization Program (RRPP) introduced dialectical behavior therapy (DPT), a cognitive-behavioral treatment. DPT, a relatively new therapy, emphasizes individual psychotherapy and group skills training classes to help individuals set goals, and learn and use new skills and strategies. It focuses on skills for mindfulness, emotion regulation, distress tolerance, and interpersonal effectiveness. DPT has proven to be exceptionally successful among RRPP consumers.





### SHORT-TERM REHAB

Our **short-term rehab** program expanded with the introduction of outpatient services at our main Wyckoff campus, and in Wayne at Siena Village, Summer Hill, and Christian Health Care Adult Day Services. For inpatients, our outpatient service enables individuals to seamlessly continue therapy with the same team. This continuum of care helps ensure ongoing improvement in physical, occupational, and speech therapy. People who were not inpatients at CHCC benefit just as well from our expert team, modern technology, and progressive approaches.

Short-term rehab also introduced pre-surgery conditioning known as prehab. Depending upon the surgery or illness, prehab as early as six weeks prior to surgery allows patients to build strength and range of motion, and improve functional mobility, expediting the overall recovery process.

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## **THE VISTA**

By the end of 2017, groundbreaking was in sight for **The Vista**, North Jersey's newest Continuing Care Retirement Community, for independent adults 62 and older on CHCC's Wyckoff/Hawthorne campus! More than 140 people have reserved their brand-new Vista apartment homes, and many floorplans were sold out! At The Vista Information Center, active seniors from throughout North Jersey met with a Vista Residency Counselor to review contract options, select floorplans, and learn about the financial and health benefits of life at The Vista.

Members of the Vantage Club – individuals who have made a 10-percent deposit in advance of the opening – were invited to social events and special presentations, including one by *New York Times* bestselling novelist Chris Crowley. The author of "Younger Next Year" shared how basic behavioral changes can help us delay most of the normal physical problems of aging and eliminate many serious illnesses and injuries.



**Ramapo Ridge Psychiatric Hospital** (RRPH) earned the distinction of *Disease-specific Care Certification in the Management of Dementia* from The Joint Commission (TJC), the premier health-care quality improvement and accrediting body in America. RRPH is the only hospital in New Jersey and one of only two in the nation to earn this certification.

Additionally, RRPH underwent a successful triennial survey by TJC. The survey team performed an exhaustive review of our compliance with the multitude of TJC hospital and behavioral standards during this unannounced visit. The team was very complimentary of many clinical best practices, diligent attention to building conditions, devotion to safety, and commitment to quality.

Heritage Manor Nursing Home, Southgate behavior-management unit, and Longview received a Silver National Quality Award from the American Health Care Association and the National Center for Assisted Living. We were the only Bergen County organization to receive the Silver award. Last year, CHCC was awarded the Bronze award. In 2018, we are eligible to apply for the Gold in this prestigious award program. Heritage Manor once again received a Five-Star Quality Rating from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, and was again recognized as one of the Best Nursing Homes in America by *US News & World Report*.

Longview once again received Advanced Standing status from the Health Care Association of New Jersey and the New Jersey Department of Health. This is the

sixth consecutive year that Longview has received the designation since it was developed six years ago. Longview also received a 2017 Excellence in Action Award from NRC Health for outstanding resident satisfaction. Longview renovations received national recognition for design excellence by *Environments for Aging* magazine.

**Hillcrest Residence** underwent a deficiency-free survey by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (DCA). Many areas of compliance with care and services, resident records, and facility requirements were assessed on this unannounced survey.

On an individual level, our employees received recognition, as well. **Hany Sourial, MD, Heritage Manor's Medical Director**, was elected as Fellow to the American College of Physicians, an internationally respected and diverse community of internal- medicine specialists and subspecialists united by a commitment to excellence. **Raymond Finamore**, Plant Operations, was named Caregiver of the Year by the Health Care Association of New Jersey and was also the recipient of the Excellence in Care Award presented by LeadingAge New Jersey. Both are associations for non-profit senior organizations. LeadingAge New Jersey also recognized **Elisabeth Micich-Otero, MSN, RN-BC**, Quality and Education, for Professional Advancement.

**Center Life**, our quarterly magazine with a circulation of 76,000, received a Gold Aster Award. The program is an elite, national competition dedicated to recognizing outstanding excellence in medical marketing. CHCC publications have received 32 awards over the past 16 years.

Caroline Silva became part of Christian Health Care Center (CHCC) history in 2017 when she was named the third Volunteer and Community Outreach Coordinator in its 107-year heritage.

"I have spearheaded volunteer programs in several different healthcare settings," Ms. Silva says. "Christian Health Care Center truly has the most caring environment."

Volunteers have been instrumental to CHCC's growth since its founding in 1911. They worked tirelessly to raise funds to convert a 17-room farmhouse into what would become New Jersey's first private psychiatric hospital. Some walked miles from nearby towns to perform the actual renovation. CHCC's formal volunteer program launched in March 1961. Volunteers at the inception were known as Cherry Blossoms in reference to the color of their smocks. The Junior Volunteer program for teens 13 to 17 was established in 1990.

Today's volunteer force of 193 adults and teenagers annually donates approximately 11,000 hours of their time and talent to CHCC.

"Christian Health Care Center volunteers truly embrace the mission," Ms. Silva says. "I'm impressed by how long some volunteers have served here."

duties, from helping with activities and making friendly visits with residents to organizing and assisting at fundraisers, to serving on the boards of trustees and other committees.

"We have so many opportunities to volunteer at CHCC because we have such diverse programs and needs," Ms. Silva says. "I am particularly impressed by the number of former short-term rehab patients who express interest in volunteering. They appreciated the assistance volunteers provided to them when they were patients and now they want to pay it forward."

Moving the volunteer program "technology forward" is a top priority. This entails not only infrastructure on the backend, such as upgrading volunteer-data software, but also ensuring that volunteer services are in line with "online."

"As technology is changing, we are trying to anticipate needs," Ms. Silva explains. "For instance, one of our independent seniors at Hillcrest Residence asked if a Junior Volunteer could teach her how to use an iPad so she could communicate with her grandchildren."

As CHCC continues to grow, so, too, will the volunteer program - in size, scope, and service.

"Volunteers give so much and they get so much," Ms. Silva says. "Volunteering boosts health, lowers stress, and offers companionship."

- In 2017, \$898,500 of charity care was provided for patients and clients of our mental-health services and individuals in our senior-life residences.
- Additionally, CHCC absorbed \$8,631,100 due to the unpaid cost of Medicaid, public programs, and other indigent-care programs.
- For the broader community, CHCC participated in health fairs, presentations, and workshops; invited various organizations to utilize CHCC meeting space; and joined efforts to improve neighborhoods' overall environments. In 2017, these activities equated to \$59,900.
- Collectively, non-billed care and services for the community totaled \$9,589,500 in 2017.

Whenever possible, we compare ourselves against similar programs nationwide. Surveys for Heritage Manor Nursing Home, Southgate, Bolger Rehab Gym & Wellness Center inpatient program, The Longview Assisted Living Residence, and Ramapo Ridge Psychiatric Hospital are all conducted and analyzed by national companies which conduct surveys in similar health-care programs. The results are computed as percentiles or percentage. Satisfaction surveys for our other services and programs are conducted internally by our Service Excellence/Patient-Resident Experience Department. These programs include Christian Health Care Adult Day Services of Wayne and Wyckoff, Evergreen Court, Hillcrest Residence, Siena Village, Summer Hill, Christian Health Care Counseling Center, and Ramapo Ridge Partial-hospitalization Program. The results are computed as a score between 0 and 100 points.

For surveys conducted by national companies, results are ranked by percentile. For surveys conducted by our Service Excellence/Patient-Resident Experience Department, results are ranked by points. Average scores for 2017 were as follows:
