#### **Blood-Draw Clinic**

The Valley Hospital holds a monthly blood-draw clinic on every third Thursday. Call Susan Matyiku to register at (201) 848-5837. Residents will need to present their Medicare/insurance card and a physician's prescription. Results will be sent to the prescribing physician. You must register and provide copies of insurance and prescriptions to Susan by the Monday of the week of the blood draw. In order to avoid unexpected out-of-pocket costs, please check with Susan for a list of insurance plans accepted by Valley Hospital Lab.

## **Snow Removal Policy**

Snow plowing at Summer Hill takes place during snowstorms of two inches or more. The Summer Hill Maintenance team is responsible for plowing the parking lot roadway. The Maintenance team will also be plowing the parking spaces this year. Sidewalks, common areas, and visitor parking spaces will be plowed and shoveled before resident parking spaces to allow emergency vehicles and staff access to the building. Resident vehicles and spaces will be cleared as soon as reasonably possible. Residents have two options for having their space cleared.

- Clear off your own vehicle: Residents will be contacted by telephone by the Maintenance team and given approximately 30 minutes to clear off their car and move it to a visitor space so their space can be plowed. Residents are not permitted to save parking spaces with cones or other items. These items will be removed and disposed of by the Maintenance team.
- Have your vehicle cleaned and space cleared by staff: Place your \$20 check made payable to Summer Hill of Wayne II, LLC in an envelope with your name, apartment number, and car keys in the snow removal box located in the lobby of each building. DO NOT put in the rent box. A member of the Maintenance team will return your keys when complete.

Please do not ask the Maintenance team for priority in clearing off your vehicle and/or space. All drivers are required to clear their vehicle within 24 hours. Your cooperation is critical for the safety of all residents. If you do not clear your vehicle and move it to have your space plowed or clear the parking space yourself, it may result in an additional expense. Summer Hill is not responsible for any injuries incurred on the premises due to inclement weather. Please use caution when leaving the building.

## Important Updates and **Reminders**

- Do not leave your apartment door or ajar. It should be closed for your security and to comply with fire regulations.
- One decorative item per door is permitted. Please do not use comm hooks or nails on the door; over-the hangers are preferred.
- We encourage you to add persona touches to your apartment. However decorating common areas and hall is prohibited. Items placed in the common areas will be disposed of.
- Shades/blinds are the residents' responsibility, so if you need or wa new ones, you must purchase ther

Happy New Year! The year 2023 is behind us, and we are looking forward to a brand-new year. Did you make a New Year's resolution? Many times we make resolutions with good intentions, but they are often forgotten before the end of the month.

Try to make your goals achievable – success is a big motivator. Look at your current lifestyle, determine where you may need to improve, and then work on one goal at a time. Here are a few suggestions for realistic goals to set for 2024:

- 1. Eat a healthier, well-balanced diet to promote good nutrition and a healthy weight.
- 2. Stay active by getting regular exercise to maintain strength, flexibility, endurance, and balance - consider joining our seated exercise class.

## Social Security Award Letter

By now, you should have received your 2024 Social Security award letter in the mail. We ask that all residents residing in a low or moderate income apartment or those that have Section 8, bring the letter to the Isabel Galindo, Occupancy Specialist in the office so a copy can be made and kept on file for your annual recertification.

How much is the increase for 2024? Social Security benefits and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments for approximately 70 million Americans will see a 3.2% increase in their Social Security benefits and SSI payments in 2024. This is the annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA). When the increase takes effect: The increase will begin with benefits that Social Security beneficiaries receive in January 2024. Increased SSI payments will begin on December 31, 2023.

We recommend that you keep your letter in a safe place since it serves as proof of current income
